## Civil Service



The Commercial Course is one of the most important and practical courses in Pe tersburg High School. Two years of short hand, two years of typing, and one year bookkeeping are offered in our high school.

One of the objectives of the department is to prepare students for courses in Accountancy and Business Education, which they will pursue in college.

Another objective is to prepare students for life in the business world. Throughout the course, emphasis is placed on spelling, grammar, and speed and accuracy in skills.

One of the opportunities for employment, afforded to seniors through the State Civil Service Examinations is the Civil Service Examinations. Mrs. H. P. Satorius of the high school faculty has been appointed as a state monitor. The test consists of three parts. The first is a two-hour test, evaluating the ability of the student in spelling, grammar, mathematics, and office skills. The second part is a test in various typing skills, including work in rough drafts, letters, and general typing ability. The third part is a test in shorthand, dictation, and transcription rates. If the student passes in each part of the examination, he is called by the State Department for an oral interview. This year twenty-seven students took part.

Another opportunity for employment to seniors is through the Federal Civil Service Examination. A federal examiner for this district conducted an examination in Pe tersburg High School for twenty-seven students.

## Senior Class History

On August 29, 1955, sixty-two pale faced freshmen with shaking knees entered the halls of P.H.H.S. After becoming acquainted with the new routine, they elected as President, Polly Sutton; Vice-President, Don Shawgo; Secretary, Bill Grosboll; Treasurer, Sandra Trenary. The Student-Council representative was Marilyn Chester. Their sponsors were Mr. LaHann, Mr. Worthington, and Mrs. Wood. Another epidemic of nervousness overtook them when the initiations came around, but they lived through it.

On the following August 27,1956 , fifty-five students of the same group returned to P.H.S. with an entirely different outlook on life. The election of class officers named Don Shawgo, President; Bob Vogt, Vice-President; Polly Sutton, Secretary; Linda Peterson, Treasurer; and Marilyn Chester and Georgia Rensman as Student-Council representatives. The sophomores demonstrated hilarious antics in the Sophomore Stunt under the direction of Mrs. Peterson.

As Juniors, they began the year on September 3, 1957, forty-eight strong. They intellectually chose Don Shawgo, President; Polly Sutton, Vice-President; Sandra Trenary, Secretary-Treasurer; and Marilyn Chester, Danny Wilson, and Bob Vogt as Stu-dent-Council representatives. Sponsors for the Junior year were Mrs. Satorius, Miss Holloway, and Mrs. Greenhalgh. The Junior Class play, "Tom Sawyer", was presented on November 14 and 15 under the direction of Mrs. Greenhalgh.

The gala event of the year was the Junior-Senior Prom which was held at the LeLand Hotel in Springfield on May 9, 1958. While practicing for the prom, under the supervision of Mrs. Satorius, they did get to "know each other better" as they emphasized in the theme: "Getting To Know You".

With enthusiasm forty-three seniors of 1959 entered their last year at P.H.S. on August 28, 1958. They chose Don Shawgo, President; Polly Sutton, Vice-President; Vicki Lounsberry, Secretary; Marilyn Chester, Treasurer; Student-Council representatives, Joan Neumann, Linda Peterson, Bill Grosboll and Bob Vogt. Seniors sponsors were Miss Terry, Miss Masters, Mr. Haddick and Mr. Bagby. The Senior Play, "Peg of My Heart", was presented on April 2 and 3 under the direction of Mr. Costigan. With Mrs. Satorius as the efficient business adviser, and Miss Terry as the competent literary adviser, the publication of the Sphinx had a successful completion.

The Seniors closed their final year as guests of the juniors at the Junior-Senior Prom, held on May 8, 1959. May 22 was Class Night. On May 24, they attended Baccalaureate Services with Rev. Driskill as speaker. The grand conclusion of a most successful high school career was reached with honor-Graduation, May 26, 1959.
